Reduce & Reuse a Bag



Supplies:

- Old t-shirt
- Scissors
- Fabric paint
- Paintbrush
- Rhinestones, glitter, pompoms, or other decorations
- Glue
- · A grownup to help cut

Directions:

- 1. Cut off the sleeves and neckline.
- 2. Decide how deep you want your bag.
- 3. After turning the shirt inside-out, draw a line across the bottom where you want the bottom of the bag to be, then draw a parallel line 3 inches lower.
- 4. Cut the second (lower) line, then cut 1/2 inch fringes up the shirt, stopping at your first line.
- 5. Starting on one side, tie two fringes together from the front and back of the shirt. Continuing tying them all together across the bottom of the shirt.
- 6. Tie another row, but this time, tie the fringe next to it. This will keep items from falling out of the bottom of the bag.
- 7. Turn the bag right-side-out.
- 8. Decorate and paint designs on your bag, and help the planet!
